
Ottawa 4th April, 1919.

Sir:-

Referring to your letter of the 26th ultimo, I re-enclose herewith one copy of the voucher amounting to \$60.75 which you submitted in favour of Mr Charles Davison, of Hantsport, for relief supplies. In several cases a bag of flour has been charged for at \$3.00. Be good enough to state the quantity of flour contained in each bag. I may say that if only 34 lbs were in each bag the charge is too high. I have also to point out that \$14.00 is considered a high charge for two bags of flour, which presumably weighed 100 lbs each.


In future butter should not be issued to destitute Indians. It is too expensive, and not considered necessary.
