NOTES ON PROCEDURE OF CRESTON RECLAMATION COMPANY  
FOR PERMISSION TO RECLAIM CERTAIN AREAS IN  
THE VICINITY OF CRESTON, B.C.

- Oct. 22, 1926: Letter from Secretary to Commissioner informing him that the Creston Reclamation Company would apply to the Minister of Lands for approval of plans of works of construction for the reclamation of a portion of Kootenay Flats. Plans to be filed in the Office of the Comptroller of Water Rights, Victoria. Any objection to the above mentioned plans and application are to be filed with the Comptroller of Water Rights prior to the expiration of 30 days after the first publication of the notice.
- Nov. 23, 1927: Letter from Mr. Whyte of the Dom. Water Power Branch re hearing of the application of the Creston Reclamation Company before the International Joint Commission.
- Oct. 27, 1932: Letter from Mr. Webb to Mr. Perry informing him that he had been asked to prepare a report for the Department in connection with the proposal of the Creston Reclamation Company to reclaim some 1,000 acres in the Kootenay Valley near Creston (A copy of this report is not on file in this Office)
- Oct. 18, 1934: Copy of letter from Indian Agent Ryckman to Secretary, enclosing draft lease, in triplicate, covering 1920 acres of Lower Kootenay I.R. to be leased to Creston Reclamation Company.
- Dec. 20, 1934: Copy of letter from Indian Agent Ryckman to Secretary, enclosing payroll of distribution of \$720.00.
- July 16, 1934: Copy of letter from Acting Supt. General to Creston Reclamation Company indicating terms under which the Department would ask the Indians to surrender.
