supplies the remedy by mak-God ing another sun to shine in the great deep. Imagine this power (the Spirit of God) applied to the millions of stars that inhabit space, as He moves on the face of the waters of every world therein. The smaller bodies circulate around the larger, producing phosphorescent rings of light around every star that shines as a sun. This is the explanation of the "Milky Way" and of all the nebulæ seen in the astronomer's telescope.

And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters, and He said, "Let there be light, and there was light."

HEAT.

This is one of the conditions that was to remain while the earth existed. Every creature has its own heat. Every world has its own heat. But do we get our heat from the sun? The heat which we call sun heat is produced by the direct rays of light coming to a focus in the air, producing therein a chemical change which we call "heat." This can be illus-
