(\*) By the Imperial Statute 7 and 8 Victoria, Cap. LXIX, enacted :—That it shall and may be lawful for the said Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, or any General Rule or Regulation, to be binding upon all Courts in other Foreign Settlements of the Crown, requiring the Judges Not taken before such Court in any cause appealed, and of the Reasons given of such Court, or by any of them, for or against the Judgment pronounced by such Court; which notes of Evidence and Reasons shall by such Court be sent to the Clerk of the Privy Council within one calendar month next after the Judgment of such Court to prosecute any appeal to Her Majesty in Council; and the said Committee, shall be binding upon all Judges of such Courts in Foreign Settlements of the Crown.

In virtue of this Statute their Lordships made an order of the 1 directing that the reasons of the Judges of the Court appealed from referred by the Registrar in original to the clerk of the Council at the other proceedings, &c, are transferred.
