

- Wire of Iron or Steel, galvanized, tinned or coppered, or not, of 16 guage or smaller, when imported by manufacturers of wire cloth and wire work to be used for these purposes in their own factories, until the end of the next session of parliament. C. C. Aug. 9, 1887.
- Anthracite Coal Dust. O. C., Nov. 22, 1887.
- Copper rollers for use in Calico printing when imported by Calico printers for use in their factories in the printing of Calicos and for no other purpose, (such rollers not being manufactured in Canada.) O. C., Nov. 22, 1880.
- Retorts, pans, condensers, tubing and pipe, made of platinum, when imported by manufacturers of sulphuric acid for use in their works in the manufacture of concentration of sulphuric acid. O. C., Dec. 17, 1887.
- Green fruits and edible berries, in their natural condition, viz.:—Apples, Apricots, Bananas, Cherries, Mangoes, Olives, Peaches, Pineapples, Plums, Plums, Pomegranates, Quinces and Shaddock. O. C., April 13, 1888.
- Blackberries, Cranberries, Gooseberries, Raspberries and Strawberries. O. C., April 13, 1888.
- Seeds, viz.:—Clover, grass and flower, Canary, Chia, Cotton, Jute, Mustard, (brown and white), Sesame, Sugar beet, Sugar cane seed, and seeds of fruit and forest trees not edible. O. C., April 13, 1888.
- Seeds, aromatic, which are not edible, and are in a crude state, and not advanced in value or condition by refining or grinding, or by any other process of manufacture (in addition to those already on the free list), viz.:—Anise-star, Caraway and Cinnamon Seeds, and Tenquin beans. O. C., April 13, 1888.
- Trees, shrubs and plants, viz.:—Apple, Cherry, Peach, Pear, Plum, Quince, and all other fruit trees and the seeding stock of the same, Blackberry, Currant, Gooseberry, Raspberry and Rosebushes, Grape and Strawberry vines. O. C., April 13, 1888.
- Shade, lawn and ornamental trees, shrubs and plants. O. C., April 13, 1888.
- Vegetables, viz.:—Citrons, Melons and Yams. O. C., April 13, 1888.
