Method of making Pot and Pearl Ashes, and praying that the Bill in favor of Angus McDonell, and others, now pending before this House, may not be passed into a Law, and that the Petitioner may be also heard at the Bar by his Counsel in Support of the Petition.

On Motion, refolved, That Mr. Glenny, be heard by his Counsel, pursuant to the Prayer of his Petition, and also Mr. James M'Donell.

Mr. Glenny, was then heard by his Counsel at the Bar, on the Merits of his Petition, as also Mr. James M. Donell, in support of the Bill in favor of Angus M. Donell, and others, and thereupon.

On Motion of Major Barclay, the Bill was read a second time.

Major Barclay, moved that the Bill be now committed to a Committee of the whole House, which being seconded.

Mr. Dight, then moved, that the Consideration of the Bill be deferred to the next Session, which passing in the negative.

The House on motion of Major Barclay, resolved, itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the Bill tosecure to Angus M. Donell, and others, enjoyment of their new invented Method of making Pot and Pearl Ashes for a limited time.

The Bill, intitled, an Ast to regulate the times of bolding the Inferior Court and General Sessions of the Peace, in the District of Colchester, and to enable the Grand Juries in the said District, to assess Monies for the purpose of Eresting a Court House and Goal in said District, and for ascertaining the Boundaries for the said District, Agreed to.

A Meffage from the Council with the Bill to prevent the growth of Thiftles, also,

The Bill to regulate the times of holding the Inferior Court &c. in the diffrict of Colchefer agreed to.

The House went again into Committee.

Mr. Pyke took the Chair,

The Speaker resumed the Chair,

The Chairman, reported from the Committee that they had made fome Progress in the Bill to them referred, and recommended the further Consideration thereof, to be deserred to the next Session, which Report the House agreed to.

Committee on Bill in favor Angus M' Donell and others, report.

Then the House adjourned until Monday at half past nine of the Clock.

On Motion of Major Millidge, refolved, That the further Confideration of the Bill for preventing the introduction of indigent and diffolute Persons into this Province, which are, or may be likely to become Chargeable, to the same be deferred to the next Session.
