

revenue is chiefly due to the lessening of the rate of taxation, which was the first accomplishment of the Laurier government. In reducing the scale of duties and establishing the British preference the Liberals lessened the tax levind for revenue and protective purposes and in so doing not only made easier to purchase imported luxuries money for luxuries, by stimulating the eral prosperity. That the revenue is greater under the lower rate is due simply to the fact that the people of Canada are not only more numerous they were ten years ago. And in the second place, the deduction of extravagance from the fact that this enlarged revenue has been spent is utterly fallous; and if it were sound would condemn the Conservative gritics more
