Zeppelin Raid Brought War Home to Thousands

of Britons. WOMEN AND CHILDREN GONE

Grief Not Shown to Public-Streets Now for Sight-

Special Wire to the Courier. London, Feb. 4.—One of the mos ateresting features of the later stor ies of the recent Zeppelin raid over parts of England is the effect which the visitation had on the minds of the inhabitants of rural towns, which nitherto has been far removed from the horrors of war. One correspondent writes:

Dutles—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within sine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Preemption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, critivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.


