WILL MEET 28TH NOVEMBER.

Absence of Ministers in Europe Delays Opening of Parliament.
Ottawa, Oct. 21.—At a meeting of the Cabinet Saturday afternoon the date of the opening of Parliament was set for Nov. 28. It had been hoped that the departmental reports and preparation of the legislative program would have been sufficiently advanced by this time to enable Parliament to open on Nov 14 or 21, but unavoidable delays and the absence of several of the Ministers in Europe on business of state during a large part of the simmer have resulted in holding back the opening by two weeks. At Saturday's council the principal question discussed was the mission of Hon. Mr. Lemieux to Japan. It is confidently expected that when Canada's case is presented to the Japanese Government by Mr. Lemieux Japan will consent to abide by the understanding as to a limitation of immigration to Canada in force when the treaty was signed, but it will be made perfectly plain by Mr. Lemieux at Tokio that if the immigration is not limited as desired by Canada, the Government at Ottawa will promptly give the six months notice necessary to abrogate the treaty. Mr. Lemieux, in order to reach Tokio as quickly as possible, has again changed his plans, and instead of going via London has cancelled his passage on the Virginian for Friday next, and will now go via Vancouver, sailing from that port on the 28th inst., as originally intended.
