Dedication of Willard Fountain. The idea embodied in the Willard Fountain originated in the mind of Miss Anna Gordon, superintendent of the Loyal Temperance Legion for the World's W. C. T. U.

The bronze statue of a little girl—a child of the people, offering in her outstretched hand a cup of cold water to men and women, boys and girls, and inviting horses, dogs and birds to drink from the trough at her feet, represents the work of three hundred thousand temperance children, members of the Loyal Temperance Legion.

London furnished the sculptor, Mr. Geo. E. Wade, and Maine New Hampshire Granite company presented the granite for its use. On the child's cup are the letters L. T. L. The cost of the statue is upwards of two thousand dollars, which sum was collected in all over the world.

Willard."
