Our readers have thus an opportunity of judging for themselves as to the manner in which the Government have conducted the financial concerns of the Province during the past year.

Our contemporary says that "had it not been for the windfall of the pier-money, Sullivan & Co. would have run the Province into debt, on the one year's transactions alone, to the tune of \$52,496.31."

The Patriot seems to be annoyed because the Expenditure exceeded the Estimates by some \$30,000, and because his own estimate of \$330,791.54 was exceeded by an Expenditure of \$394,205.24, or nearly \$60,000 of an excess.

It will be observed that the only departments in which the Estimates were at all seriously exceeded, were the Education, the Public Works, and the Public Works.
