ton and lamb, over 10,600,000 pounds Poultry and game: Ducks, fowls, tur keys, etc., more than 1,000,000 pounds Fish, about 1,660,000 pounds, says th Washington Post, Beverages: Chan pagne, claret, minerals, etc., 800,00 odd bottles, besides 500,000 gallons of lager beer. The amount of bread consumed was 3,900,000 pounds.

Potatoes stand at 20,000,000 pounds butter at 1,200,000 pounds, and ice a 24,000,000. Cigarettes and cigars were smoked up to the tune of 2,327,225. Taking just this last item, and allowing three cigars and seven cigarettes as a daily dose per head, the number of smokes consumed in one single year on these liners would keep 10 men in tobacco every day of their existence for a period of about 70
