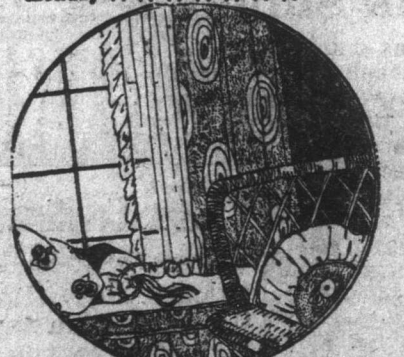

## "Just Tony."

Tony, perhaps the best-known horse in the world, started life as a very ordinary fellow—in fact, he was a rather ungainly, very obstreperous colt, one of a bunch of range ponies, was nothing particular in front of him except more ranges, a good bit of work, and an occasional out in winter-time.

For this reason, there is no fear of his being stolen. Although, as horseflesh goes, he is worth only a negligible sum, Tony is insured for \$4,000.

Whatever Tom Mix says "goes" with Tony; he is a hard worker, he understands every word, and condescends to obey—except after 4 p.m.

Tony, in the words of Tom Mix, is a strict trade unionist, and a very rigid one. The ghosts of all his ancestors, with Tom Mix on his back, wouldn't make Tony shake a hoof after tea-time. He seems to know the hours, particularly around the mid-morning interval, and dinner-time.

## He Doesn't Like "Doughboys."

Tony hates the arc lights; he considers the out-of-door heat quite enough to go on with, and he and Tom often have a few words when it comes to an "interior" with the thermometer registering 100 degrees.

So, as Tony had to be obeyed, this doughboy was modelled separately, sitting on an old hack, and afterwards transferred to the back of the sculptured Tony! The live one certainly didn't take to the doughboy at all!

Tom Mix was born and brought up on a ranch, and he rode before he could walk. He served in the Spanish-American war as a mounted scout, and was with the United States Army during the Boxer rising in China.

He is said to sleep in the saddle, but as the only saddle he fancies nowadays is Tony's, and Tony is a strict disciplinarian, this is probably not true.

But the fact remains that, whenever Tom Mix is seen in the studios, he either rides in on Tony's back, or Tony paces nonchalantly behind him, his nozzie in the small of Tom's back, ready, at a signal, to sit down beside his master, shake hands affably with his master's friends, and prepare for a friendly exchange of views with fellow "stars."
