Activity in the Pacific.
 The curious and obscure international situations that have arisen in the past two months relating to the Pacific, and the countries like Japan, the United States, Britain, the Netherlands, Holland and France, are of great importance to the people of these waters. Before and during the war the Allies left the Pacific largely to the United States, which had a treaty of alliance with Great Britain that proved eminently serviceable. Japan is also a member of the Four Powers Naval Conference at Washington last year, which also embraces Great Britain and the United States; which provides for mutual respect of each other's interests in the Pacific. For reasons which have not been clear, Holland, which has a large colonial empire in those waters, did not participate in the conference. So far as we can collect no statement was made as to whether the Dutch were to participate, but the Four Powers did the just and proper thing and made an official declaration of Holland's interests in the Pacific would be respected. Recent events indicate that, so far as the Pacific is concerned, there is a prevailing confidence in the sense provided by that treaty. With adequate explanations the British Admiralty had announced its purpose of expending a large sum in the construction of a naval base at Singapore. The scheme has been attacked in certain American newspapers, especially the one in the Philippines. The British administration in the Philippines has recalled how the British naval friendship with the United States during the Spanish phase of the Spanish-American war, are not likely to raise questions to the strengthening of the United States naval power in the Pacific. Holland, despite the declaration above alluded to, seems to have been not at the Singapore conference but at the situation generally. She has in hand a Naval bill which is said to meet with popular approval, providing for greatly increased expenditures to provide protection for Java and other valuable possessions in the Pacific. The Commission appointed by the Dutch Parliament to consider the Powers Treaty in its final stage said that there was still a lack of fuel for a conflict in the Pacific.

It is only possible to guess at the European powers which have the largest interests in the ocean to these precautionary steps, but unquestionably mean a strengthening of the white man's hold in the Pacific. The population in all the colonies held by the white nations in the Pacific has been based on fears of Japanese encroachments. This feeling is common not only to Australia and Zealand, but to the Pacific Coast of the United States and Canada. In most English speaking dominions that are accessible by sea to these enterprises and immigration settlement is openly hostile. In the United States and Australia, the Powers Treaty is by no means popular because Japan is a signatory. The naval policies of both the United States and Holland are probably based on the feeling that the Treaty is the last, because of the popular opinion in Japan.

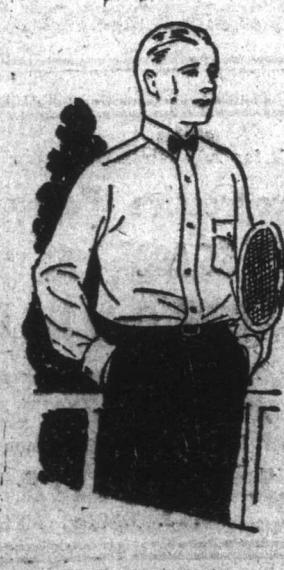
