



Over the Thames The People Will Have Electric

Transit Before the City.

London West's Street Railway Franchise Awarded

To the Lendon Street Railway Company-Terms of the Agreement-Electric or Horse Care—Col. Clark's Solicitor Cp. pessa It.

The London West Council struggled for about five hours Friday over the proposed electric railway. The meeting wa called to consider the bylaw granting a franchise to the London Street Railway, prepared by Solicitor Bartram at the suggestion of the council. An unusually large number of ratepayers were present. The chamber was packed. Solicitor Hellmuth, Manager Break and Director Smallman represented the railway. The bylaw in question was a voluminous document. It provided for the giving of a franchise until March 8, 1925, being ecterminating with the company's franchise in the city. The line was to be operated in connection with the city system from Kensington bridge to Oxford street bridge, by way of the Wharnolits road, with the right to use electricity or horses, and to be in operation by Nov. I next. The company was to arrange for transfers at Kensington bridge until such time as they acquired the right to pass the river on that structure. On Dundas street, between the bridge and Wharnolife road, the tragk was to be four inches above the present level of the street, and the thoroughfare was to be graded and graveled up. Only one track on Dundas street, with aswitch, would be permitted. On Wharnolife road and on Oxford street the track was to be built two feet from the Wharnclifle road and on Oxford street the track was to be built two feet from the benter, so as to allow of an additional track when connection could be made by a oridge over the river on the Wharncliffe to London South. The company was to provide all the materials and keep in repair the tracks as well as two feet on either side of these without expense to the corporation during the term of the ranchise. The cars were to be run litteen hours a day — every twenty ninutes.

Nearly all the other provisions were similar to those in the city agreement with slight variations. One of these was irregard to the fares. Workingmen's tickets were to be issued at the rate of eight for 25 cents, good from 6:30 a.m., to 8 a.m., and from 5 p.m., to 6:30 p.m. The services for fifteen hours is three hours longer than is at present required in the city. The cars were to be heated in winter. The payment of a fare entitles the passenger to a ride over any portion of the line in London West or in the city.

At the expiration of the term the corporation was to be allowed to take over the railway at a valuation. Only one year's

poration was to be allowed to take over the railway at a valuntion. Only one year's notice for such a proceeding was to be required.

The bylaw was read a first time on motion of Councilor Spence, seconded by Councilor Smith. It was then considered in a committee of the whole. The former gentleman was in the chair. Saveral amendments were made. The most important of these—proposed by Councilor Smith—provided that \$1,000 be deposited with the village treasurer by the company on signing the agreement, to be forfeited in case the line was not constructed by the last of November.
