Clubs in the Eastern League, American Association, and Pacific Coast League will be affected by the action. The committee on revision of the constitution decided that the matter of salary regulation was too large for it to handle, and it recommended that it lay over until the next convention.

An amendment adopted allows any player suspended longer than ten days by his club to carry his case before the national board.

The constitution was so changed as to make it possible to reduce a player's salary if he does not make good and goes to a league of lower classification.
