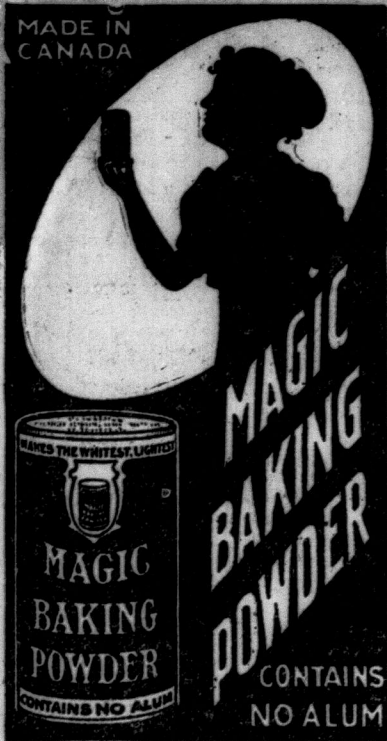




NOT OUR "BILL" COLES.

URGE AMERICANS TO HELP EUROPE IN DRY STRUGGLE

Norway Accuses France and Spain of Plotting Against Prohibition Laws.

THREATEN BOYCOTT

Copenhagen, Aug. 22.—Will the prohibitionist nations unite and defend themselves against the action recently taken by the vine-growing states to force the prohibitionist nations to repeal their prohibition laws. This question was placed squarely before the Anti-Alcoholism congress today by the president, Dr. Herod of Switzerland.

To the American delegation the question was: Will the delegation advise the prohibition forces in America to urge the United States government to protest to France, Spain and Portugal against their threat of commercial boycott. Tantamount to a threat of starvation, against Norway, Finland and Iceland.

Laws a Farce.

By virtue of this club, it was explained, two of these three northern countries are compelled to either repeal the prohibition laws or include so many exceptions that they become virtually inoperative. Will America protest or will she, Dr. Herod inquired, remain passive while other European nations strangle the prohibition attempts of small nations.

The facts Dr. Herod said are that France compelled Norway to raise her legal alcoholic percentage from 12 to 14 so as to admit Burgundies and compelled her to admit the French quantity of Cognac. Spain and Portugal have now demanded that she raise the alcoholic percentage of wines to 18, so as to permit sherries and port to come in, otherwise they threaten to raise the tariff so as to make virtually impossible the sale of Norwegian fish and the navigation of Norwegian ships in the waters of these countries or those of their colonies. Since the shipping of fish is Norway's chief means of purchasing her imported foodstuffs this was to threaten starvation.

Finland Threatened.

Norway's prohibition laws already have become a farce. Iceland was obliged to repeal prohibition. Finland also was threatened.

"The prohibitionist states must unite in common resistance against the economic pressure of alcohol-producing countries," Dr. Herod said. The American delegation has held hitherto that it is here to consult and that it is unable to take any action, but it is believed that the members from the United States would be glad to do something to help protect the smaller prohibition states if an appropriate way could be found.

Fail In Ceaseless Search To Find N. Y. "Crying Baby"

New York, N. Y., Aug. 22.—A house-to-house search for three-month-old Lillian McKenzie has yielded no trace of the "crying baby" missing since Saturday. Police were just as baffled by the puzzling mystery today as they were when they began the search last Saturday. The few leads they have followed have been of no avail.

Sixty-five additional detectives have been called into the chase. Nearly 200 operatives are working exclusively on the hunt for the missing baby. Rewards have been offered

The mother is completely distracted. Fear for her life is expressed, and even if she does survive her reason may not remain unless her baby is returned, according to attending physicians.

The father, broken by loss of the babe and weakened by his endless, tiring, sleepless search, has turned his energies to care for his wife. He paced before a telephone hoping for some favorable information about the loved one, attempting to comfort the sorrowing mother, meanwhile.

British Farmers' Union Replies On Branding of Export Cattle.

London, Aug. 22.—The report from Montreal that the Canadian Society

for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals would endeavor to prevent the electric branding of store cattle for export is dealt with by President German of the National Farmers' Union in an interview with Reuters. "Having come to an arrangement with us," he said, "they are now trying to break down everything." The president of the Farmers' Union pointed out that the regulations with regard to exporting cattle from the Dominion merely stated that the cattle must be indelibly branded. The method of branding was left to the Canadians to decide for themselves.

WILL USE OLD "SHAMROCK" AS "TRIAL HORSE" FOR NEW
