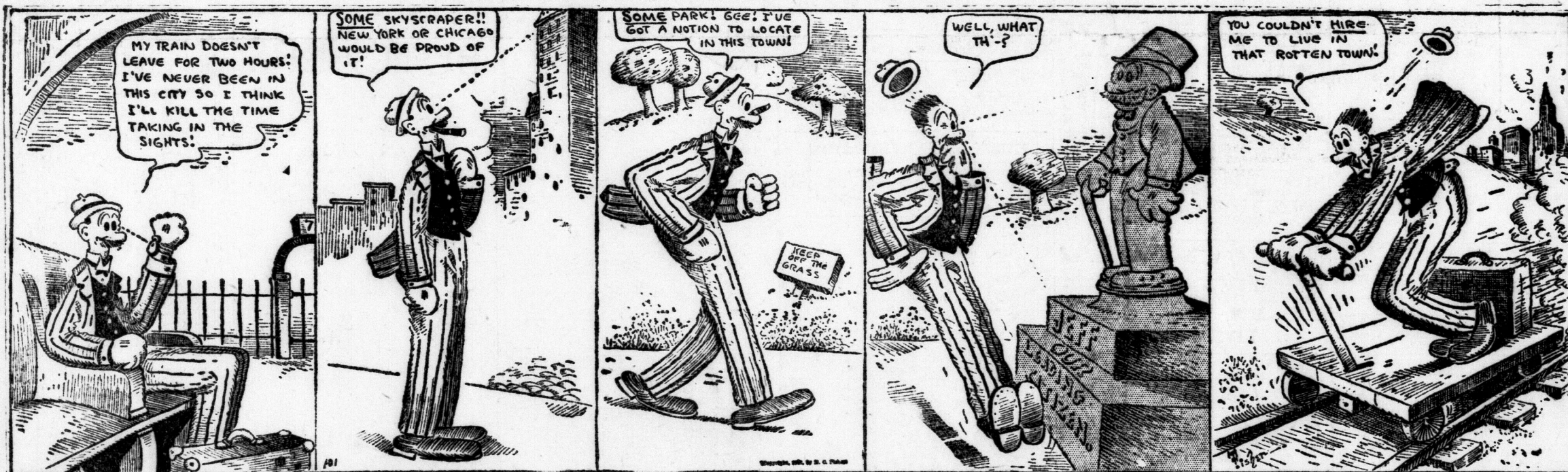

PROMINENT CITIZEN OF GALT SUCCUMBS

Fred P. Palmer Was Actively Identified With Business Enterprises of City.

Galt, Dec. 18.—Another of Galt's prominent citizens has been summoned by death in the person of Fred D. Palmer, of Brant road, who passed away Saturday afternoon at 5:30 from a combination of pneumonia and heart trouble. While in poor health for three months, his condition was only serious for three weeks. He was in his sixty-third year, born in Rochester, N.Y. He came to Galt when 17 years of age and had lived here ever since. For many years he was office manager of Shurley & Deitrich, and ten years ago retired. He was one of the incorporators and a director of the Canadian Porcelain Company, Hamilton; organizer and director of the Great Western Felt Company. Elmira; vice-president, Galt Stove Company, and director of the Galt Chemical Company. He was a member of the Galt Club and president of the South Waterloo Conservative Association. He was interested in every branch of sport and was active in golf, curling, bowling and fishing. A widow, one son, Douglas, Toronto, and one daughter, Mrs. Bradford Ellis, Los Angeles, survive; also three brothers and one sister in Rochester and Mrs. J. C. Dietrich, Galt, a sister. The funeral takes place Tuesday. There were no turkeys on Saturday's market, but plenty of other fowl, selling at geese 30 cents pound, ducks 40 cents, and chickens 25 cents. Eggs have reached the high water mark for the season, 75 cents a dozen. There will be a four-man contest for the two offices on the public utilities commission at New Year's. A. W. Mercer and R. B. McGregor being opposed for re-election by W. A. Dixon and H. O. Hawke. With only the interior woodwork to be completed, it is expected that the new depot of the G. R. R. and L. E. & N. radial lines on upper Main street will be formally opened next Saturday. Hespeler's new Carnegie library will be completed next month, and it is hoped to have it in use by the first of February.
