Forest, Dec. 7.—The stock breeders of this district, following their successes at the Royal Show, are now bringing back many important prizes from the Guelph Winter Fair.

Brandon Bros. had the grand champion Clydesdale of the show in Forest Favorite imported, foaled in 1920, winning the Canadian Clydesdale Society golden medal and the Clydesdale Society silver medal. Koepke, charged with keeping liquor for sale in connection with the finding of 70 gallons of alcohol hidden beneath the garden at his home Wednesday evening, was found guilty by Magistrate Weir today and fined \$1,000 and costs.
