

THE KILKENNY BATTLE.

Devitt Claims a Majority of One Thousand for Sir John Pope Hennessy.

LONDON, Dec. 22.—All day Sunday the two parties were busy electing the priests, both those of the O'Connell and others from various parts of the country, spending the time outside of religious services in pressing their views on the people and urging the election of Sir John Pope Hennessy. Altogether, more or less direct, were made from the pulpits to the pending contest.

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PARNELL DEFEATED.

The McCarthyites Secured a Sweeping Victory in the Kilkenny Election Contest.

Sir John Pope Hennessy Defeated Vincent Scully by Nearly Two to One.

Talk of Protesting the Election—Mr. Gladstone Congratulated Upon the Result.

LONDON, Dec. 23.—The vote in the North Kilkenny election yesterday stands as follows:—Sir John Pope Hennessy, anti-Parnell, 1,358; Mr. Vincent Scully, Parnellite, 2,557. The excitement of the election has subsided and the streets have resumed their usual appearance. Opposite the court house, where the ballot boxes were being counted, a few persons are gathered, but the crowd has dispersed.

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
