PERU RUBBER

ATROCITIES

Lima, Peru, August 6—Complete order is reported to prevail today in the Peruvian zone of jurisdiction of the Putumayo rubber district, where terrible atrocities committed on native workers were recently reported to have occurred, by Sir Roger Casement, who carried out an investigation on behalf of the British Government.

A despatch today from the city of Iquitos, on the upper Amazon, says both the press and authorities of that district express their convic tion that the authors of the recent crimes in the Putumayo region were Colombian marauders, entirely un connected with the firm of Arana, former owners of the rubber region,

It is also asserted in the newspapers that the reports of outrages were spread in order to discredit the Arana family, whose influence in the Peruvian Amazon Company was unpalatable to some of the British shareholders.
