Cap. 66, initiated. "An Act to impose a duty on Foreign Reprints of British Copyright Works." and the issuing of an Order of Her ainjeaty in Council under the Imperial Act of the 10th and 11th Vio. Cap. 85, suspending, so far as regards this Dominion, during such timeas the said first mentioned Act continues in force within the same, the prohibitions contained in certain Acts of the Imperial Parliament against the importing, selling, lotting out to hire, exposing for sale or hire, or possessing, foreign reprints of books first composed, written, printed or published in the United Kinndom of Great Britain and entitled to the copyright therein.

Whoreupon, under the authority of the said Act of the Parl ament of Canada, it was by His Excelency, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, Ordered, and it is hereby ordered, that on, from, and after the first day of October next, all Copyright works being first composed or written and printed in any other country, and with regard to which the notice to the Commissioners of Customs required by any Act of the Imperial Parliament in that behalf, shall have been furnished the Customs Department for that purpose, by the Imperial auti-orities, may be entered for duty on payment of twelve pounds ten shillings upon every handred pounds value thereof—and under and subject to the same regulations as dutable goods are now, or may hercatter be, admitted to entry for payment of duty under the authority of any law of this Dominion relating to Customs, Trade or Navigation.

That all sums collected as duty on such Copyright Works shall less the cost of advertising, postages and making up the accounts of the same, at the end of every fiscal year, any 30th June, be remitted to Her Maj-sty's Principal Secretary of State for th

WHEREAS it has been represented to His Exceliency through the Board of Agriculture of the Province of Ontario, that the contagious disease or epidemic affecting Horned Cattle, which recently prevailed in many parts of the United States of America, has almost entirely disappeared, and it is therefore expedient that the Order in Council of the 13th August last, prohibiting the importation or introduction of Horned Cattle from the said United States of America into the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, he revoted, and the importation of Horned Cattle into Canada, permitted under certain Regulations hereinafter mentloned,—

after mentioned,—
His Excellency in Council, on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Agriculture, and under the provisions of Act 29 Vic., Cap. 15, has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 8th day of October instant, the Order in Conneil of the 13th August last prohibiting the importation of Honed Cattle from the said United States of America into the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, thall be, and the same is hereby revoked.

His Excellency in Council, under the authority aforestid, has further been pleased to make the following Revalutions, that is to say:

All Rancay Companies conveying such cattle shall be, and they are hereby, required to cause the cars used to the conveyance of the same to be thoroughly eleaned and disinfected immediately after the removal of the cattle they often.

These Regulations shall remain in force until the First day of November next, and longer.
