to small private enterprises. In a survey of the seven-year period from 1983 to 1989, it was found that 26 per cent of the awards went to small companies, 26 per cent to large companies, and the remaining 48 per cent to medium-sized companies. In total, 95 companies have been chosen for this award to date, from over 1,200 applications received. The 1989 winners received their awards from International Trade Minister Crosbie at the annual meeting of the Canadian Exporters' Association.

Centres for International Business Studies

This program of Centres sponsors international business studies at universities across Canada. The Centres encourage the development and presentation of courses for students in international business subjects and disciplines. The Centres also offer seminars and workshops in similar subjects for Canadian businesses to enhance their participation in the expanding world economy. In addition, research in the international business field is sponsored to ensure that the courses and seminars remain relevant to the changing conditions found in international business.

Centres are located at Dalhousie
University, the École des Hautes
Études Commerciales, the University
of Western Ontario, the University
of Manitoba, the University of Saskatchewan, the University of Alberta
and the University of British Columbia.
An eighth centre, the Centre for Trade
Policy and Law, is located in Ottawa,
and is a joint project of Carleton University and the University of Ottawa.

Although the centres at Saskatoon, Edmonton and Ottawa were established late in the previous fiscal year, their formal inaugurations were held during the past year. Trade Minister. Crosbie launched the Centre in Ottawa, Deputy Prime Minister Mazankowski opened the Centre in Edmonton, and Minister of National Defence McKnight opened the Centre in Saskatoon.
