JAMES GEORGE

Mr. George was born in Toronto on September 14, 1918, and attended the University of Grenoble in France before graduating from the University of Toronto in 1940. Mr. George was a Rhodes Scholar. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve in 1940 as an Ordinary Seaman and following duty in the United Kingdom, North and South Atlantic and the Mediterranean, he was discharged in 1945 with the rank of Lieutenant-Commander.
