The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Mitchell Sharp, announced today that Canada is represented at a meeting in Brussels, April 13-23, to consider a draft convention on the travel agency contract. The draft convention was prepared by the International Institute for the Unification of Private Law (UNIDROIT). Its aim is to obtain international agreement on the legal principles which should govern travel agency contracts.

The Canadian delegation includes officials from Alberta, Quebec, Newfoundland and Ontario, as well as representatives from the Federal Government. The Chairman of the delegation is Mr. E. S.
