9. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred and forty-four thousand, six hundred and sixty-two dollars and fifty cents be granted to His Majesty, for Department of Railways and Canals—Salaries (including M. J. Butler at \$8,000; G. A. Bell at \$2,800, and C. B. Robinson at \$1,200), \$129,662.50; Contingencies, \$15,000, for the year ending 31st March, 1910.
