Sixty nations are required for ratification of this convention, 51 now have and it is extremely important that at least 9 more sign it. It is certainly incumbent upon Canada to take its part in that.

## COURT CHALLENGES PROGRAM

Mr. David Dingwall (Cape Breton – East Richmond): Mr. Speaker, I have two petitions to table pursuant to Standing Order 36 calling upon the Government of Canada to rescind its decision with regard to terminating the Court Challenges Program. This petition is signed by residents of the province of New Brunswick, in particular from Campbellton, New Brunswick, as well as Mann Mountain, parts of Restigouche, Sainte–Anne, as well as other parts of that province.

The second petition deals with the same subject matter signed by numerous residents of Kingston, Ontario, who are all in agreement that the termination of the Court Challenges Program is indeed an injustice and the government ought to rescind its decision forthwith.
