The Committee recommend, that a Law be passed to render the powers of the Commissioners of the Revenue more efficient and better defined. It would seem expedient to point out by Law, the control which that Board should exercise over Outport Collectors, and all Public Accountants, that they may be enabled at any time to ascertain the true state of the Revenue.

The Committee find that some of the Out-port Collectors are negligent in rendering their Accounts, and delinquent in payments, and have been so reported for years past, but no effectual measures have been taken to remedy the evil.
