Asked for the grounds for his suspicion, he said it was grounded upon his experience when buying hogs to restock the piggery last February.

Dr. Bryce stated that as far as he could learn there was absolutely no inspection either of the pork for the local market, or of the animals and cars that are continually arriving at the cattle market. 


