

Near-Sightedness and Vision.

Far-sightedness may be compensated Far-signtedness may be compensated to a certain degree by straining to focus the eyesight, but there is no way in which the near-sighted eye can overcome its deficiency, save by artificial lenses. By squinting the lids, so that some of the marginal rays of light are excluded, the near-sighted may make vision slightly clearer, but only slightly.

Near-sightedness tends to progress from bad to worse from year to year, up to the age of 20 to 25 years, when it generally does not show further inrease.
If the child is carefully treated from ne earliest discovery of the defect f vision, which is usually around the ge of 7 or 8 years, fairly good ision will be retained throughfut life. If the near-sightedness is not ecognized and properly treated the

recognized and properly treated the eyes may undergo grave changes which may threaten vision itself.

By proper adjustment I mean the regular care and advice of the oculist. When the oculist has measured the child's vision and considered the child's individual requirements he will prescribe the proper lenses and instruct the child or parents as to the care of the eyes.




