S., Dec. 22 .- "On and after December 28, the employes of the Canadian National Railways will refuse to handle freight of any kind originating on, or destined for the Legionaires. properties of the Dominion Steel Cororation and the Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Company until these corporations consent to submit the present difficulties with strlking railwaymen, formerly employed in their yard, to a board of
