BERLIN, Aug. 29.—The beer war which has broken out in Germany as a result of the increased tax on the fatherland's favorite beverage is spreading a remarkable wave of teetotalism throughout the country.
An attempt of the brewers' and saloonkeepers to raise the price of beer in order to recoup themselves for the higher tax now imposed is meeting with angry resistance everywhere.

May Address Public Meeting at Glasgow in Protest.
NEW YORK, Aug. 29.—W. T. Stead cables The American from London, Eng: The political sensation of the week has been the announcement that Lord Rosebery, formerly the Liberal prime minister, has promised to address a public meeting at Glasgow to protest against the budget.

McLARY'S WINNIPEG BUILDING GUTTED BY FIRE; LOSS \$150,000.

WINNIPEG, Aug. 29.—(Special.)—Fire, which broke out after 11 o'clock last night, gutted the six-story warehouse of the McLary Manufacturing Co. of London, on Balfour-avenue. The loss is put at \$150,000, covered by insurance.
John C. Latham of New York, who died recently, bequeathed \$10,000 to his stenographer and \$25,000 for distribution among his employees.

Russia's Mimic German War.

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 29.—War manoeuvres on a vast scale on the plains between Gatchina and Narva have occupied the ear and the leading Russian generals the past week. The area of operations is located within a three days' infantry march of St. Petersburg and the entire scheme was remarkable for political candor.
The strategic advisers of the czar started on the assumption that Russia was at war with Germany before the navy had been sufficiently reconstructed to defend even the upper coasts of the Gulf of Finland. German warships were assumed to have convoyed troops to Narva, where they had embarked an invading army within a hundred miles of the capital.

H. B. Warner Dead.

NEW YORK, Aug. 29.—Harry B. Warner, for many years a well known theatrical man and for the last four years theatrical manager for Henry W. Savage, died last night in a local hospital of pneumonia. Mr. Warner was 83 years old.
