Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

The sole head of a family, or any male

The sole head of a family, or any male over 13 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years, A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least \$6 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for outtivation under certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. alongside his homestead Price, \$3.00 per acre.

Duties.—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent, also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settier who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres, and erect a house worth \$360.
