The recipe for Cereal Pudding, mentioned above, is as follows:—
Cereal Pudding—
One cup cooked cereal (left-over).
Two cups scalded milk.
Half cup molasses.
One and a half teaspoon salt.
One and a half tablespoons butter or butter substitute.
Four milk on cereal and mix well. Add remaining ingredients, pour into greased pudding-dish and bake one hour in slow oven.
