THE GROWING CASUALTIES.

Canadians are again figuring heavily in the casualty lists. They are fighting on the Somme front, where the Germans are making desperate efforts to check the slow but steady advance of the British and French.

CARLETON COUNTY.

WHERE ARE THE FLAG-WAVERS?

Apparently the Borden government has a very warm spot in its heart for United States contractors. The latest evidence is revealed in connection with the new arsenal, and the story is thus told by the Toronto Star:—
