### THE WAR

This morning's advice from the Allied capitals leave the extent of the Roumanian reverse still in doubt, though command is had enough. Nevertheless, in regarding it one must remember that though Roumania is still suffering heavily from its mistaken policy of invading Transylvania without properly guarding its other fronts, and while the Allies have lost, through the Roumanian reverse, a great chance of shortening the war considerably, the German success in the Balkans is, after all, only an offset to Roumania's entry on the side of the Allies.

Today's despatches concerning the whole war have just one message for us, and it is that Canada must brace itself to meet the fact that the war will be longer and harder than was recently supposed, and consequently our contribution in men, in money, in national consecration to the work in hand must be increased in proportion. In a new and more complete sense we must "stand up to meet the war."

When, in 1898, in the late middle of the Civil War, some people in the North kept asking Lincoln how much longer the struggle would last, and when many hinted at an inconclusive peace, he answered in the spirit in which we must answer now. He said:

"It is a pertinent question, often asked in the mind privately, and from one to the other. When is the war to end? Surely I feel as deep an interest in this question as any other can, but I do not wish to name a day, a month, or year when it is to end. I do not wish to run any risk of seeing the time come without our being ready for the end for fear of disappointment because the time had come and not the end. We accepted this war for an object, and the war will end when that object is attained. Under God I hope it never will end until that time."

\* \* \* This war has taken three years; it was begun or accepted upon the line of restoring the national authority over the whole domain, and for the American people, as far as any knowledge enables me to speak, I say we are going through on this line if it takes three years more."

Surely that is what Kitchener would say today if he could speak.

### AGAIN, THE KAISER

The Kaiser has not been quoted so often as late as was in earlier stages of the war, but the death of his ally—or dupe—Emperor Francis Joseph of Austria, has called forth a characteristic utterance. In a message to the new emperor he says the government of the late ruler of the dual kingdom "will live in the history of the monarchy as a period of blessing."

"We of the younger generation were accustomed to see in his venerable figure examples of the finest virtues of rulers, and truly kingly devotion to duty. The German Empire loses in him a loyal ally. I personally lose a paternal and highly honored friend."

"God's inscrutable will has called him away in the middle of the greatest world war, and has not permitted him to see the result of the struggle and the return of peace. May God give him eternal rest, and to you strength to bear the burden which falls upon you at this grave time."

Thus the pious waver of war against women and children.

Of course only farmers and dealers who are Liberal in politics will take advantage of this. Conservatives could have no "truck or trade with the Yankees."

German submarine raiders, perhaps only one, are reported to be again in the waters of this side of the Atlantic. There is a difference found, however, when compared with the last visit. That was a surprise while now it is most likely that patrol vessels have been on the look-out and are better prepared to meet the conditions.

Though admittedly serious, the situation of Roumania is not regarded by London's military writers as beyond hope. Those whose views carry most weight agree that there is a chance of a repetition of the Marne.

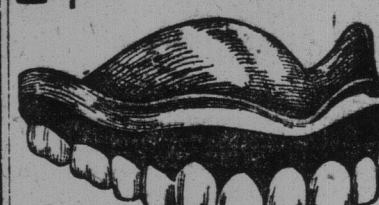

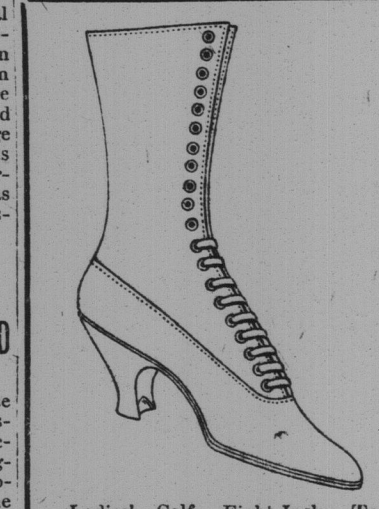
