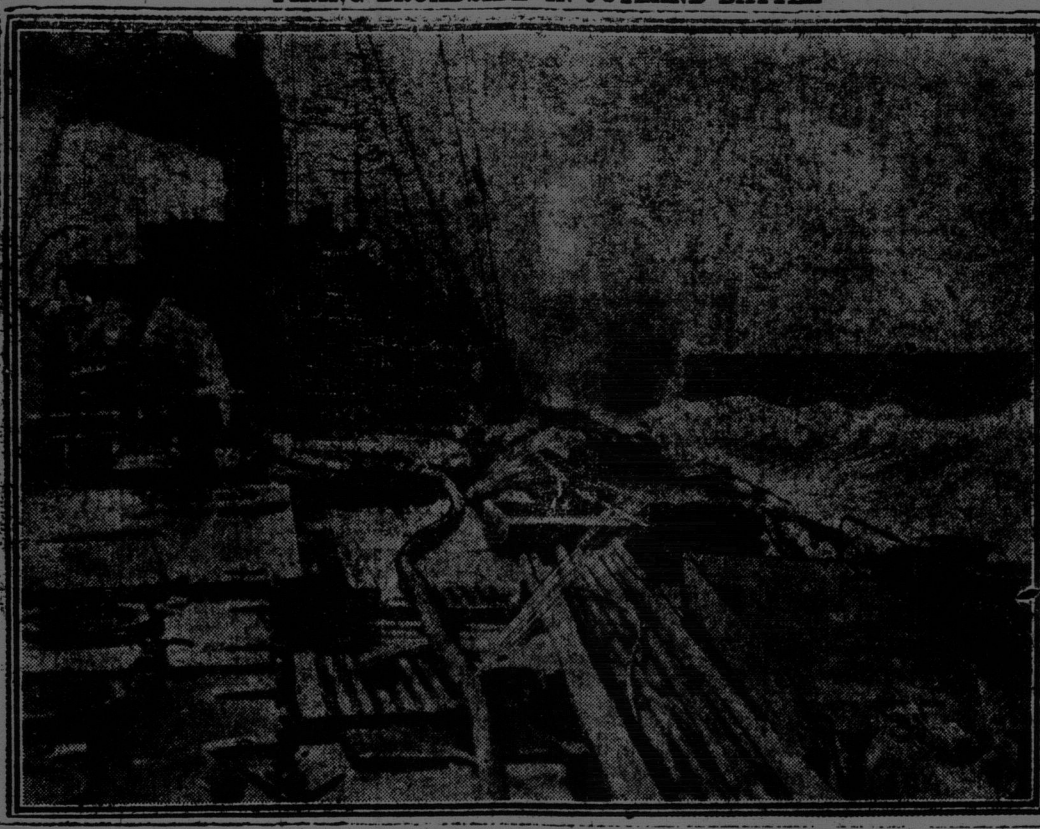

FIRING BROADSIDE IN JUTLAND BATTLE



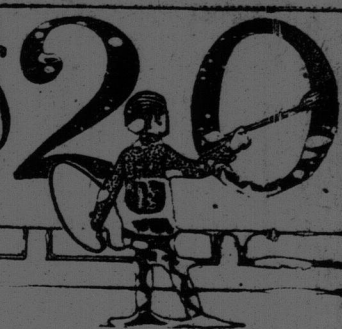

MATTER OF THOSE SCOTT
ACT CASES IN FREDERICTON
SEEMS HARD TO KEEP DOWN(Fredericton Gleaser)
Somehow those twenty-eight Scott
Act cases that created such a stir in
Fredericton in March last are not to
pass from the public for some time at
least, notwithstanding the fact that the
appeal court put the quietus on them
about a week ago.
These cases are now to engage the
attention of the city council, and there
will probably be some interesting discus-
sions when they are formally considered
by the aldermen. Last evening Mayor
Mitchell told the council that he had
learned from Chairman William McKayof the police commission that Police
Magistrate Limerick's bill for the twen-
ty-six cases was \$222.50. The bill had
been sent to the police commission and
is still in the hands of the chairman,
and of course could not be acted upon
last evening by the council.
There was, however, a short but some-
what pointed discussion regarding the
bill and the now celebrated twenty-eight
cases. Some of the aldermen did not
seem to favor the payment of the bill
and declared that somebody had blun-
dered in the cases, which were eventually
thrown out by the higher court and the
city was minus any revenue. Some
aldermen defended Magistrate Limerick,
stating that it was not his fault that
the stenographer had not been sworn.
There was no action taken in the matter,
which is likely to be discussed at the
next regular meeting of the council in
