REPLY READY WITHIN NEXT THREE WEEKS

Difficulty Is Found In Question of Arbitration Treaty

NO EXCEPTIONS

France Says Plan Should Cover All Disputes With All Nations

PARIS, July 22—The exchange of views regarding the German note began today between the French government and the other governments of the Allies.

BERLIN, July 22—The German security note, which is delivered to France and Great Britain, Monday, expresses satisfaction that the Allies are disposed to co-operate with the German Government for the consolidation of peace by way of a mutual understanding, offers opinions on the Allied proposals on some questions of principle, and makes reservations on points of detail for final negotiation.


