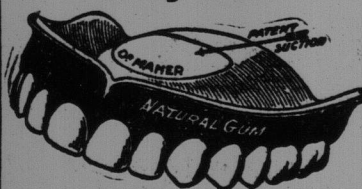
### THE PRINCE'S EXAMPLE.

### FISHER'S PROTEST

London, Sept. 2.—(Reuters).—The protest couched in vigorous language in yesterday's Times by Lord Fisher on the expenditure has evoked interesting comments. Lord Fisher declared against alleged ruinous waste in the navy which now costs £140,000,000 annually as compared with £24,000,000 in 1904, notwithstanding that the German fleet does not exist. Lord Fisher declares that half the navy is already obsolete and should be scrapped and says that the other half will be equally useless in a few years because of internal combustion engines and oil.

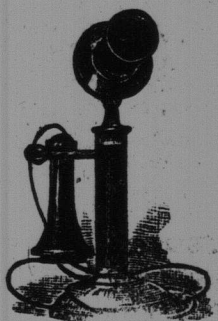
