"Bought and Paid For" Scores a Triumph - Best Comedy in Many a Day

Not only is this play immeasurably superior to anything that Mr. Broadhurst has done before, but in one of its characters at least, James Gilley, he has drawn a picture of a parasite which is a creation.

This role of Gilley as played by Frank Craven, and the almost equally droll and human character of his adoring wife as played by Marie Nordstrom, keep the audience in such fits of laughter that the serious story of the play becomes almost of secondary interest, and yet so admirable is the work of Julia Dean and Charles Richman in the leading roles of the telephone girl who marries for money and the young millionaire whose wife deserts him because he insults her when he is
