3. I have A.F.R. 110, signed by J.B. Martineau, Captain T/Officer Commanding Composite Provost Company, M.B. 4. It refers to the apprehension of D-535560 Private Gimble Max of the 1st Battalion Edmonton Fusiliers, who is the accused before this Court.

4. Will you hand that to the Court, please, and offer it as an exhibit.
