THE CIVIC ELECTIONS

The Civic elections yesterday were more interesting than usual, because they were the first held under the act of union, and also for the reason that there was a contest in all of the thirteen wards, with the exception of Lantzburg, where Dr. Christie, and Mr. W. A. Chesley enjoyed a walk over. In each of the West side wards there were five candidates, which raised matters somewhat, but in both contests the successful men had good lead over their competitors. The result is that Carleton returns three of her old representatives Messrs. A. C. Smith, James O. Stockhouse and W. B. Baskin, the new man being Israel C. Smith. Two of Carleton's old members Messrs. Lander and Deane were defeated. Not all the eloquence of Timothy Donovan, nor his lavish expenditure for the benefit of Carleton in forming a selection of one to go to Fredericton to demand a free ferry could save him from defeat. He got but 37 votes, which was less than one third the votes polled by the lowest of the successful candidates. The North End enjoyed all the delight of an old time election. In Lord Ward a great effort was made to defeat Mr. John A. Chesley and it was successful, the union commissioner and ex-mayor of Portland being beaten by just two votes. Both the Lantzburg, Messrs. David H. Nase and Joseph Horne were re-elected. In Stanley Mr. George R. Craigie, who did not file his nomination until late on Saturday, and had not before been spoken of as a candidate, got only 18 votes, the old members, Messrs. Carleton and Metcalfe being returned by landslide majorities. The candidate of Mr. Craigie is said to have been due to a desire on the part of some persons to prevent the Stanley aldermen from working in Dunlop Ward for Mr. John Kelly, but the latter was returned at the head of the poll with 44 votes, but three votes behind him. In Victoria Ward, Mr. A. H. Forster was defeated by a narrow majority, the successful candidates being Messrs. Busby and Law.

THE TELEGRAPH AND THE EVANGELICAL ALLIANCE

The Telegraph is engaged in the congenial work of abusing the members of the evangelical alliance, because one of the speakers said at the last meeting, that there was an evident reluctance on the part of some and an evident unwillingness on the part of others to give information on the question of Roman Catholic marriages. Another member was not pleased because the Atty.-Gen. had not answered a letter which he had received. The Telegraph considers that these complaints are merely conjuring up imaginary grievances against the government, and takes occasion to meet at the alliance for not meeting Mr. Wain's secularist in debate. These attacks and sneers are no doubt prompted by a certain ecclesiastical prejudice who, having no fixed religious views himself, seeks like to undermine the faith of others who may not have advanced so far on the road to infidelity. But the Telegraph will not improve its position by listening to the advice of this person, or by taking the part of the government against the respectable body of clergymen and laymen who compose the Alliance. The Telegraph says there is not any reason to believe that the government are more favorable to one religious denomination than to another in the matter of marriages, but the Alliance may have good reasons for refusing to accept this view of the opinion and preferences of the government. Recent events have shown that the government consider the fact of a man being a Roman Catholic, a good reason why he should be forced into St. John civil office, and another man, who is a Protestant, dismissed in view of such an instance as the members of the Evangelical Alliance may think it quite proper to question the motives of the government, and in doing so they will have the support of the majority of our people.

SOME AND COMMENT

The Sunnyside Pioneer says that the excitement over the appointment of Mr. Ritchie is dying out in this city and that the local government in New Brunswick is too strongly affected by the resignation of two of their supporters from the city of St. John. This comes of writing without knowing the facts. There are no few in this city, so few spots of greenery so much brick, and stone, and dust, that on some "among green leaves" seems to give one a new lease of life. Let our children, for once, see some foliage have such hopes. They cannot have, unless steps are taken to protect them in their enjoyment. Can health and innocence.

DECENTRAL DAVID

Now let us fit this disingenuousness to the circumstances of the Ritchie case. In this case there were the following forces arrayed against each other:

For Mr. Peters. For Mr. Ritchie. Dr. Berrymann. Mr. W. A. Quinton. Dr. Alcorn. Dr. Stockton.

Result that the government dismissed Mr. Peters from the office which he held by a legislative appointment, and appointed Mr. Ritchie in his stead. Therefore the demand of Mr. Quinton that Mr. Peters be dismissed from office was more potent than the demand of Dr. Berrymann, Dr. Alcorn and Dr. Stockton that he be retained. It is in the way that the government exercises their "judgment," that the honest electors may see that they do not come to the aid of a government that commodify the electors. The judgment of the government is about on a par with the Beacon's political honesty and good faith.
