FIRST EDITION. AN ALARMING TORNADO

THEROUGHOUT THE NEW ENGLAND STATES.

One Life Reported Lost and Several Injured by the Lightning, Which also Destroyed Some Buildings. The Tornado's Path Extensive Damage Done.

ROCKFORD, Aug. 1.—From different sections of New England reports come that the intense hot weather of the past two or three days was followed last night by severe thunder and wind storms. In only one instance is a loss of life reported.

At Rockland, Mass., the lightning struck Mrs. Finigan's house, killing an 18-month old child, who was standing in the doorway. In Randolph, Mass., John Dunn's house was struck and the father and three children were paralyzed for a time, but recovered.

In Lawrence the people suffered another fright when a tornado of wind and dust struck the northern side of the city. Trees were blown down and stripped of their foliage while the people ran to their cellars and kept under the eaves of their stables. It was the worst wind storm, except the cyclone, ever seen in this State.

In Plymouth, N.H., the thunder storm was accompanied by hail and heavy rain.

At Nashua, N.H., the storm almost assumed the proportions of a cyclone. One building was struck by lightning and little damage is reported aside from that done to the wires.

At Haverhill, Mass., several houses were struck by lightning and the trees considerably damaged.

In Orange, Mass., A. P. Putnam's barn was burned by lightning causing \$2,000 loss.

At Old Orchard, Maine, the storm created great havoc. Two large lumber sheds near Milliken's steam mill were blown down and the lumber cut into splinters.

In Waterville, Vt., several buildings were struck by lightning and a large covered bridge across the Winoochee river was badly strained, nearly causing it to fall.

At Concord, N. H., Dr. C. H. Plummer was struck by lightning and his wife knocked senseless. The building was much shattered.

At Saugus, Me., there are reports of considerable damage to the crops.

At Laconia, N. H., the wind blew down a partly finished building and John Austin, a carpenter, was badly crushed in the ruins. Great havoc was done among awnings, roofs and trees. The storm was especially severe on Lake Umbagog.

FIRST EDITION. THE NEW MANAGER.

H. P. TIMMERMAN ENTERS UPON HIS DUTIES THIS MORNING.

Eighteen Years of Railroad, Eight Years of which were spent with the Canadian Pacific Company—Several Interesting Facts about the Future Management.

This morning Mr. H. P. Timmerman entered upon his new duties as manager of the New Brunswick road now attached to the Canadian Pacific, and Mr. W. W. Cram officially severed his connection with the road.

Mr. Timmerman was a competent manager, and was held in the highest respect by every employe. He held that position for five years, and his resignation was heard with universal regret. To fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Cram, of C. P. R.'s western officials was sent down Mr. Timmerman, a gentleman whose reputation for ability and integrity is well known.

Still a very young man Mr. Timmerman now holds a highly important office, and his connection with the road is a recognition of his ability and faithfulness to the company with which he has been connected for the past eight years. He first began railroading on the Grand Trunk about 18 years ago, holding the position of conductor at the age of 16. For ten years he was established on that part of the line east of Montreal, but of this time he is now in connection with the Grand Trunk, and in 1882 occupied a position on the Canadian Pacific road of which as yet there were only 100 miles constructed in the North west. During the last three years he has been in charge of the section of the C. P. R. between Port Arthur and Winnipeg, with headquarters at Port Arthur.

His transfer, then, to St. John was sudden, because he was unaware of the negotiations which were going on with reference to the incorporation of the N. B. R. into the C. P. R. system.

Mr. Timmerman arrived in this city only a couple of weeks ago, and during the past few days he has been going over the road. After a careful and thorough inspection he is well satisfied with the condition of the road, and with the management of the road by Mr. Vanocoe. There are still a number of improvements to be made, and as soon as possible they will be begun.

A Gazette reporter, who called upon the new manager this morning, found him comfortably lodged in his new quarters, and that was more to the point in a very practical sense, and that with reference to his railroading experience Mr. Timmerman remarked upon an advantage which he possessed. He had been right at the bottom and close attached to the C. P. R. when the first few miles of that road were being built in Canada. "At that time," said he, "the railroad was in a very crude state and since then it has been continually improved. It is a trip across the continent over the C. P. R. months to nothing now, although it is but a few years since it was a very rough and primitive affair. When you consider the fact that one ticket can bring you from Japan to New York, and that the same ticket can be used in both directions, it is a fact that no other road can boast of. With regard to the fact that the road is now being improved, Mr. Timmerman stated that these would shortly be re-organized. All the business of the New Brunswick road would be conducted in St. John, although there were certain lines upon which the whole management would depend.
