REPORT No. 9 OF COMMITTEE ON LAW AND SUPERVISION.

Your Committee on Law and Supervision, to whom was re-committed our Report No. 8 on the decision given by the Grand Chancellor to Question No. 12, beg leave to report that at the direction of the Grand Lodge we recommend that the decision of the Grand Chancellor be sustained.

While the Committee follow the instructions given by the Grand Lodge in reference to this matter, yet they respectfully beg to dissent from such decision, as the question was asked with other questions in connection with trials, and is contrary to Cushing's Manual, page 12. Further, the Grand Chancellor, in addition to a direct answer, submits a proviso which appears to us to have been taken, though somewhat transposed, from Roberts' Rules of Order, and is quoted by your Committee in their former Report. This does not refer to a chairman having two votes but only one, and that only under certain circumstances.
