**A LILY POND.**  
Any one who has a nice lawn, should by all means have a lily pond. It is easily made and a thing of beauty. There are many ways of making them, ponds, either of stone, brick or masonry, but as these are all expensive, we will give our attention to another sort that will cost but a few dollars, and at the same time last for years. Have a wooden tub made similar to a wooden cistern or tank, with straight sides and about four feet deep. It can be made round or square and as large as you wish, but should not be smaller than six feet across. This size will hold six or eight tubs. One foot from the bottom have a hole two inches in diameter, and a plug to fit it, which must be put in from the inside, and project far enough to make it removable axis. Make the top of the tank exactly above this plug, so that you may know where to find it when the time comes to let out the water. This tank should then be sunk in the ground to within two inches of the top, then make a gravel border around it of about eighteen inches. When preparing the hole in which to put the tank, determine upon which side the water is to be let out, and dig a narrow trench across, and as deep, and fill it with rubble stones. This is done in order that the water will have a place to drain into when the plug is removed.
