Militia General Orders Contain Announcement to this Effect-Prizes for Proficiency in Shooting.

Ottawa, Sept. 3.—Militia general orders announce the granting of an allowance to school teachers, male and female, who attend a physical training instructional "course and obtain a Grade "B" certificate. The course is of at least 30 hours' instruction and the allowance is to be \$15.

To encourage proficiency in rife shooting, a prize of \$3 is to be granted to the best shot and \$2 to the second best shot in each squadron or company of calvairy engineers and infantry.
