Baron Burian Sees End of Austria and Hungary Unless Russian Advance on Budapest is Stopped.

London, Feb. 1.—The correspondent the Daily Mail at Copenhagen asserts that Baron Burian, the Austro-Hungarian Foreign Minister, at his recent meeting with the German Em-geror, Dr. Ewa Doleful gave a picture of the plight of the dual monarchy, and urged that the time had arrived for the Germanic powers to consider most seriously the poss#billities for a toler-able peace.

Paris, Jan. 31.—An official statement issued Saturday night by the war office read: "It is confirmed that the enemy has left a great number of dead on the field of battle, to the north of Lombaertzyde, at the foot of the Great Dune, and also before the English lines near La Bassee.

There has been a bombardment of some intensity of Arras, Reurie and Roolincourt. On the plateau or Nouvron the Germans exploded a mine, without attaining any results.

AUSTRIA

The following official statement was made tonight:

"There have been vigorous artillery duels on both sides the Dunajec and Nida rivers. Our artillery, which has been making good practice recently, succeeded yesterday in compelling the enemy, under the severest fire, to evacuate some trenches.

"There have also been artillery engagements on the rest of the Polish front. In the Carpathians the day passed quietly."

GERMANY

Berlin, Jan. 31 (by Wireless to Sayville).—The following statement was issued today at army headquarters:

"In Flanders yesterday there were artillery duels only.
