Races at Sussex Good, Though, and Large Crowd See Them

VERY NEAR TO THE
TRACK RECORD

Gloria Takes Free-for-All and Daisy Wilkes the 2.25 Class—Two Drivers Called Before Judges' Stand and One Replaced.

day's racing here today drew a big crowd of people to the track. The class of horses was the best that has been seen for a course of being the star attraction. After the great race at Moosethat Friday last between Goldsmith and the Queen, the fact that Terrace Queen, the fast mare from Bridgetown, was entered, a big contingent of horsemen from St. John, Monrovia and other points in the colony came to see the race.

Gloria again, however, showed Missam's way under the wire in three straight races. In the first race, she won in five seconds, while Terrace Queen, which was looked upon by a large number of the present as having a better chance, was captured only three times. Czarnia, as she is expected brought up the rear.

A lot of money changed hands as a result of the racing. The winning, probably most of which was Terrace Queen money.

In the third heat of the free-for-all, the Duke of Holops, the colored driver, captured Terrace Queen, to the stand as the re-

sult of protests by the nation's leading trainers, who refused to have their own horses run against a horse who had won her win. His explanations, however, were satisfactory, as he maintained stoutly that he was using his best equipment and that he was not going to let anyone else tell him what to do. He was himself as indignant that there should be any imputation of wrong doing.

In the 2:25 class Dan Patch, Fred Goetz and the race in third place, straight heats, but was pushed hard in Meadowdale, the local horse, which landed at three seconds.

Three westerly wind blowing across the track made recording breaking times about impossible. The 2:13 mare started at 2:13.40, but she did not get to 2:13 was 2:13.34 by Gloria, while the best in the 2:25 class was 2:22.12. In the third heat of this trot, a pair of horses, one of which was owned by the late Dr. Frank Krolm, claiming that the mare had been drinking, Krolm's driver was called to the attention of the judges and told to discontinue driving and Driver Mack was asked to take Krolm in hand.

The Free-for-All.

In the start of the free-for-all the horses drew positions as follows: Oxaria first; Gloria, Terrace Green and Simas in order; Emma to the front; the straggler, George, to the front with Simas and close behind, Terrace Green being well up on the leader with Oxaria trailing in the rear. These positions were never changed, though the three horses finished very close together.

The finishes in the two succeeding heats were in the same order.

The 2.25 Class.

The drawing for position in the 2.25 class resulted as follows. Fleetwood, Daisy Wilkes, Meadowdale, Frank Krohn, Hazen Gay and Warten F. Daisy Wilkes and Meadowdale went ahead of the other horse long before the quarter was reached. In the eighth, at once narrowed down

between them. With Warren F. and Hazel Gay close up and having it for third position, the race was a pro-
one. Amid great excitement, however, Daisy Wilkes went under the wire with Meadowvale hardly a length in rear. Warren F. romped in third and Scum, which passed Gay, went in as fourth.

The second heat was still more exciting than the first, with Daisy and Meadowvale finishing almost neck and neck.
