Clowser, formerly of London, Eng. Is a merchant and a J. P. Has held the office of Postmaster. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g. e. 1882. Unseated for holding office while in the Ho. and reelected April 1883. Re-elected at g.e. 1886 and 1890. A Liberal—Campbreton, Lot 4, P.E.I.

MACDONALD, HECTOR C. (Queen's 4th Dist.)

Grand f. arrived in P. E. I. in the ship "Polly." from Inverness, Scot. in 1803. B. at Belfast, P. E. I., 3 May, 1857. Ed. at Prince of Wales Coll. Charlottetown and McGill Coll. Montreal, graduating B. A. 1881 and B.C.L. in 1883. Is a Barrister at Law. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at last g. e. A Liberal—Charlottetown.
