Sat in the Ho. of Assem. for Carleton from Nov., 1868, until 1873, when he resigned, and was an unsuccessful candidate for the Commons. Re-elected and sat in the Ho. of Assem. from g.e. 1878 until April, 1886, when apptd. to L.C. A Liberal Conservative.—*Centreville, Carleton Co., N.B.*

Eldest s. of Anthony and Elizabeth Woods, who came to N.B. from Irel. about 1829. B. in Co. Fermanagh, Irel., 1819. Ed. in N.B. M., Jan. 1852, Jane Eliza, dau. of John Armstrong, Esq., of Petersville. Is Presdt. of Gagetown and Petersville Railway. Sat in Ho. of Assem., N.B., for Queen's, from g.e. 1874 until apptd. to L.C. 25 May, 1882. A Liberal.—*Welsford, N.B.*

YOUNG, ROBERT, *J.P.*

Eldest s. of the late James Young, Esq., of Tracadie Gloucester, N.B. B. there 11 Nov., 1833. Ed. at Chatham, N.B. M., Dec., 1857, Sarah, second dau. of William Hubbard, Esq., J.P., of Tignish, P.E.I. A merchant. Apptd. a mem. of Ex. Council and Presdt. of that body, 17 July, 1872. Resigned with his colleagues Feb., 1883. Sat for Gloucester in N.B. Assem. from July, 1861, until the Union. Called to L.C., Sept., 1867. A Conservative.—*Fredericton; Caraquet, N.B.*
